#### Why Did You Choose to Be a Fire Fighter?

I chose the FDNY because I have a lot of family members who are civil servants and advised me to take any city exam I could. In 2017, my college held a job fair where all city institutions attended. You could ask questions, gather information, and sign up to take the test—which I did.

#### Do You Have Any Advice for Young Women Looking to Pursue This Path?

The advice I would give to young women students is: you won't know unless you try. The fear of the unknown made me nervous going into the academy, and while some days felt harder than others, I pushed through. I pushed myself so hard until I made it to the finish line. I wouldn't have been able to accomplish anything if I had never tried. We only have one life—why not spend it trying to make a difference?

You don't always have to feel like you need to prove yourself to someone. I had nothing to prove to anyone but everything to prove to myself—that I could be a New York City firefighter.

The advice I would give to any female student interested in this career path is to always remain courteous and compassionate. Within 3 years of being in my role I was promoted to a sergeant. There is no limit to what we as women can accomplish.
